Teaching Team and Year Group

Main areas of study

English

Texts and themes, we will study:

- Flip Flap Pets
- The Lighthouse Keeper series and other texts by Ronda and David Armitage
- The Highway Rat
- Bubbles (an interactive story focusing on adjectives with Mrs Lawry)

We will be revisiting the core skills of the Year 1 curriculum and focusing on building writing stamina.

Phonics

We will be reviewing the Phase 5 phonics sounds and beginning Phase 6.

Your child will also be taking part in these activities on the following days:

PE – Tuesday and Wednesday

Please ensure correct kit is in school on these days, no jewellery is worn and long hair is tied back.

Other Subjects

Wake and Shake/Up and Go – Active bursts in the morning and during the afternoon.

Geography – Does it matter where my food comes from?

Computing – Logging on/off and opening software independently

Design Technology – Designing and making sandwiches

PSHE – New beginnings

RE – Belonging-identify and talk about the key idea of 'belonging' in their own lives and how Baptism is an expression of 'belonging' within Christianity.

Music – Hands, Feet, Heart

Maths

Maths units will be:

Number: Place value

- Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0 and in tens from any number, forward and backward.
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones).
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers to 100 using different representations including the number line.
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs.
- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and words.
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems.

Number: Addition and Subtraction

- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- Show that the addition of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and subtraction of one number from another cannot.
- Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a two-digit number and ones; a two-digit number and tens; two two-digit numbers; adding three one-digit numbers.
- Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems.
- Solve problems with addition and subtraction: using concrete objects and pictorial representations, including those involving numbers, quantities and measures; applying their increasing knowledge of mental and written methods.

In addition to this we will be revisiting key content from the Year 1 curriculum.

Science

Animal life cycles:

What is the life cycle of an animal?

- Animals grow until they reach maturity and then don't grow any larger.
- Animals reproduce when they reach maturity.
- All animals eventually die.
- Different animals live to different ages.
- Different animals reach different sizes before they are able to reproduce.
- Different animals reproduce at different ages.
- Animals, including humans have offspring which grow into adults.

Home Learning

- Daily:
- Reading every day (not every day of reading needs to be recorded) just once or twice a week).
- The children's reading journals will be checked every Friday.
