





#### Next Steps Progress from 2022 /23 Sports Plan

Playleader training for next cohort needs to be arranged for next academic year. Completed September 2023 – see sports page and Nutshell

Wake and Shake / up and go to continue which contributes to a healthy lifestyle. Completed – all classes undertaking this short session, either indoors or out. Yoga training has also been completed.

Game of the week to be shared in class as part of wake and shake. Currently only in Y5, rolling out to rest of school in better weather

Pupil voice for September clubs includes Quidditch from the Hampshire Games visit. Those pupils who attended will act as sports leaders for this new sport. Completed, Quidditch resources made and the game is now on our LTP Pupils are also choosing after school clubs which interest them which now include table tennis following training from SGO in Summer term.

Rolling programme of funding to replace equipment as needed for playtimes, lessons and EYFS. Budget being spent as needed – see expenditure breakdown for this academic year













#### Forest School built into LTP for 2022/23

Completed, all classes allocated a slot, YR continue with weekly sessions -see Forest School webpage and class webpages for evidence

Risk assessments for Forest School shared with EVOLVE for full cover and monitoring by Hampshire, Completed – EVC Leader working alongside Forest School leader to upload these

Swimming at Churchers already booked for Spring and Summer 2023 Completed – programme already started and dates on LTP

## 2023/24 Plan:


All children will continue with 'Wake and Shake' and 'Up and Go' and / or yoga on a daily basis.

The new playground area will be maintained so all areas can be used for active learning.

All children will have wellies (and class welly racks) so that the field can also be used as a space all year round.











Train KS2 play leaders to run activities for KS1 at lunchtimes and to help lead at East Hampshire events.

All classes to include intra fitness competitions as part of Wake and Shake. Promote these on the sports board

The LSA team will organize active play equipment each lunchtime and ensure play is as active as possible for all children. Zones will be introduced to ensure safety for all users, activities will rotate throughout the week.

Further equip active playtime equipment sheds, maintain and extend active possible for all children.

Areas of the playground and field will be timetabled for vear groups to experience outdoor physical play/learning

Supply time for P.E. Lead and Sports Coach to provide additional opportunities off site for sports leaders, gifted and talented children and targeted groups of children needing further physical activity.

Continue training teachers in P.E., Sport and Active Learning so that Langrish School can offer a high quality of physical and active education to all children. This includes PESS level 6 for our sports coach.

Teachers will continue to be trained on implementing active lessons throughout the curriculum every week (through staff meeting CPD time)

Improve EYFS outside active areas/equipment for further active play and physically active learning


Update Forest School qualifications, including outdoor First Aid, so that this can be accessed by all children on site

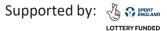
