What is the Multiplication Times Table Check?

The Multiplication Times Table Check (MTC) is a statutory test for all Year 4 pupils in England. The purpose of the Multiplication Times Table Check is to determine whether pupils can fluently recall their times tables up to 12.




Pupils are tested on their ability to answer 25 multiplication questions online. They have six seconds to answer each question, and schools are given a two-week window to 'check' all eligible children in the year group.

When is the Year 4 Multiplication Times Table Check 2024?

This year, the multiplication times table checks will be undertaken by all eligible year 4 pupils between Monday 3 June and Friday 14 June.

How does it work at Langrish?

- Beginning of June
- I sit next to each child when it's their turn
- I am there to encourage and if they can't answer one I'm there to help them 'move on' emotionally
- They have 3 practise questions
- 25 questions 6 seconds each
- They can use an ipad or computer

Multiplication tables check

Do you have a child in year 4 at primary school?

If so, your child will be participating in the multiplication tables check (MTC) in June.


The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help your child's school to identify if your child may need additional support.

What is the multiplication tables check?

It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.

What if my child cannot access the check?

There are several access arrangements available for the check, which can be used to support pupils with specific needs. Your child's teacher will ensure that the access arrangements are appropriate for your child before they take the check in June.



How can you support your child?

- Help learn all times tables – any on a post it note?
- Be supportive and relaxed about these assessments – children will pick up your 'vibes'
- Arrive on time at school having had breakfast/a snack for break
