

GOVERNORS' STATEMENT OF BEHAVIOUR PRINCIPLES

This Statement has been drawn up in accordance with DfE guidance

- Every pupil understands that they, like all children, have rights under the UNCRC (United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child), including to feel safe, valued and respected, and to learn free from the disruption of others.
- All pupils, staff and visitors are free from any form of discrimination.
- The rights respecting behaviour policy is understood by pupils and staff.
- Pupils take responsibility for their learning and for their actions, and where necessary are supported in doing so.
- Governors, staff and volunteers set an excellent example to pupils at all times.
- Staff members use rewards, sanctions and reasonable force consistently, in line with the behaviour policy.
- Exclusions will only be used as a last resort; the exclusions policy explains this and outlines the processes involved in permanent and fixed-term exclusions.
- Families are involved in behaviour incidents to foster good relationships between the school and pupils' home life.
- The governing board also emphasises that violence, abusive language or threatening behaviour will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

This written statement of behaviour principles is reviewed and approved annually by the Full Governing Body
