Maths Length and Height <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in any direction (m/cm) to the nearest appropriate unit, using rulers and measuring vessels• Compare and order lengths and record the results using >, < and = Measurement: Mass, capacity and temperature <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Read scales in divisions of ones, twos, fives and tens• Read scales where not all numbers on the scale are given and estimate points in between

Science

Pushes and pulls - Why and how do objects move?

- Objects can move (be in motion) in various ways- roll, slide and bounce.
- The pushing and pulling of an object can affect its motion.
- Pushing or pulling can do three things, slow down, speed up or change direction of an object.
- The larger the push/pull the bigger the effect on motion.
- Pushing and pulling objects can change their shape.

Home Learning
