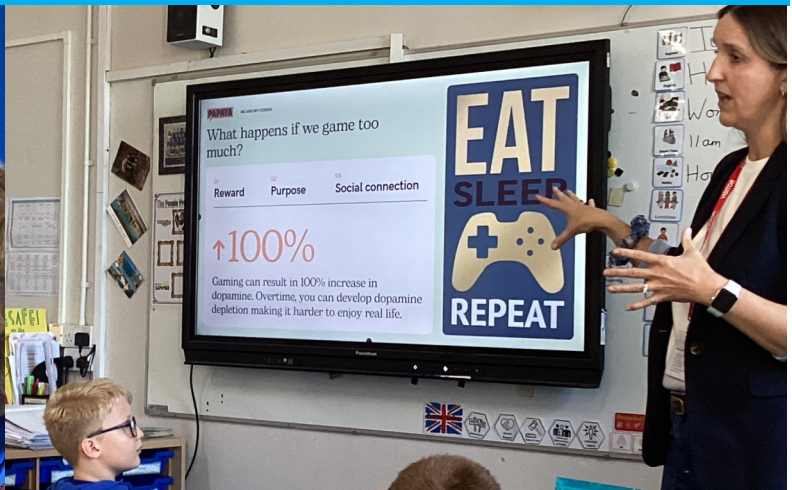
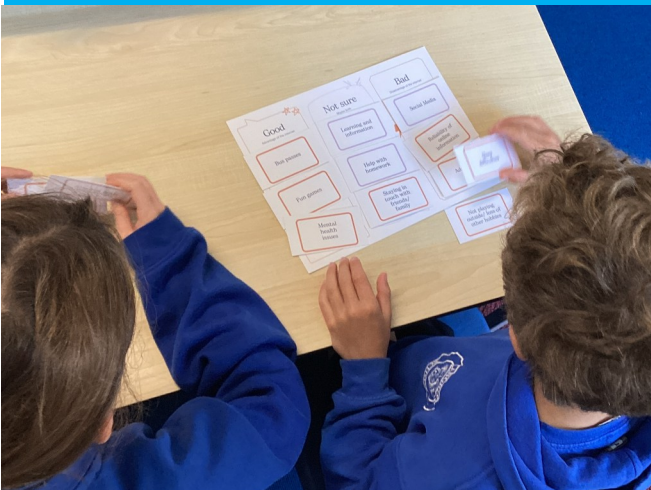


Railway Assembly

PAPAYA workshops: Me and My Screen



Following on from the success of our parent talk on Smartphone Free Childhood earlier this month, today Hannah joined us from PAPAYA to deliver workshops across Key Stage 2. Each class discussed the advantages and disadvantages of screen time, considering the wider impact of some choices we make when using our screens. Interactive activities and pupil ledges helped the children to engage with their own thoughts around screen time and to consider the balance they want to achieve. Hopefully, over time, these conversations will help our children to understand why smartphones may not be the right choice for them while they are still so young and the alternatives to these so they can continue to benefit from the advantages of modern technology.

The 'Forest' app was of particular interest to our older pupils who liked the fact that they could earn real trees to be planted by limiting their own screen time use... perhaps this would be a great way for all of us to model healthy screen time habits too!

- 02 Do more things that help your forget about your phone/ Xbox /iPad.
- 03 Don't have devices in your bedroom at night.
- 04 Set yourself time limits/ use screentime on devices.
- 05 Turn off notifications, keep it out of sight, have a flip cover, delete apps. Try the forest app.
