<p>Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Count to 50, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number • Count, read and write numbers from 1 to 50 in numerals and words • Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations • Measure and begin to record, compare and solve problems involving height and length • Measure and begin to record, compare and solve problems involving capacity and volume • Recognise and use the terms greater than, less than and equal to in relation to number and place value within 50 • Recognise the value of each digit in a two-digit number up to and including the number 50 	<p>Home Learning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular reading and record keeping in the Reading Diary • Extra reading through Serial Mash or Oxford Owl is also available • Phonics practise using the sounds and tricky words found in the Reading Diary and attached to the bottom of the Year 1 web page alongside Phonics “Alien” words to practise • Purple Mash activities either for fun or as directed by the Year 1 web page • Any other internet-based home learning activities as suggested via our class page on the school website. • Use the ‘Out and About’ maths cards attached to the school website for more ideas about fun ways to use maths in everyday situations • Practise number recognition using the flashcards attached to the bottom of the Year 1 web page • Noting how your everyday environment alters with the changing seasons
