Our pupils' salad contained the protected characteristics with a salad dressing created from our values. They also considered a menu of taste, which contained all of our differences, such as our interests, likes and dislikes, hair colour and so on.

Safer Internet Day

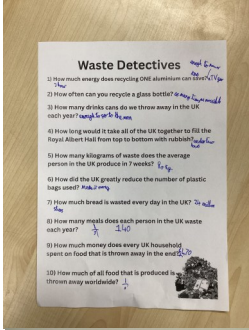


Tuesday 10th February was [Safer Internet Day](#), and we celebrated with a range of activities across the school. This year's Safer Internet Day theme was 'Safe Tech, Safe Choices - Exploring the Responsible Use of A.I.' After an assembly lead by the school's Cyber Ambassadors, several classes took part in the BBC's Live Lesson, which was a great introduction to A.I. and how A.I. chatbots are designed and programmed. In the lower school, we then looked at the A.I. technology we're most likely to interact with: the voice assistant, talking about how voice assistants can be very useful and lots of fun, but behind the speaker they're just a computer program and not a real person, and they can sometimes get things wrong. The upper school delved further into A.I. technologies, looking at the advantages and the pitfalls of this growing technology, and seeing if they could identify fake, A.I.-created digital content.

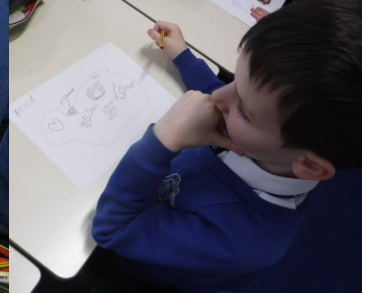
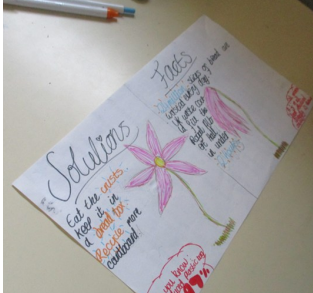




PeCAN workshops



This week KS2 have enjoyed visits from the Petersfield Climate Action Network (PeCAN). After an initial assembly on Thursday morning to talk about waste and how we can all take steps to reduce it, Scott and his team lead each class in a half day workshop focusing on waste and sustainability. Year 3 focused on biodiversity, exploring the school grounds to discover the microhabitats available for different creatures, before designing a microhabitat in the classroom and considering the creatures that might be found there. Year 4 focused on waste and recycling and learnt lots of useful facts about how (and why) they should turn waste into wonderful. Year 5 furthered their learning about biodiversity, learning about how different habitats are suited to different creatures and how each are adapted to their habitat. Finally Year 6 again tackled the tricky subject of waste and whether our recycling problem is really just a problem of too much stuff! Thank you so much to Scott and PeCAN for two awesome days filled with loads of great ideas.
