<p>Teaching Team and Year Group Year 6: Miss Coleman</p>	
<p>Main areas of study</p> <p>English</p> <p>We will continue to practise and refine the skills learnt this year, particularly editing and reviewing work using partners and dictionaries to support with this. The major aim this half term is to make much of the content taught so far more embedded and fluent in readiness for secondary school.</p>	<p>Your child will also be taking part in these activities on the following days:</p> <p>PE</p> <p>Tuesday – Rounders Thursday – Athletics</p> <p>From Wednesday 17th June, Year 6 will take part in 4 weeks of Forest School. <p>Maths</p> <p>This half term the children will be applying their maths learning to support their learning in other subjects and to solve problems arising in the various projects they are going to undertake, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Measures in DT • Statistical analysis and presentation in science and PSHE • Budgeting and profit analysis linked to the Summer Fayre 	<p>Home Learning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily reading and record keeping in the Reading Record <p>Home learning will be less formal this half term and take the form of preparation tasks to support the project work going on in class. <p>Science - Sound</p> <p>This term Year 6 are revisiting their learning on sound. Their learning will focus on describing sound, understanding how it is made and travels and investigating changes in pitch and volume.
