Year R and KS1 EARA Class Assemblies

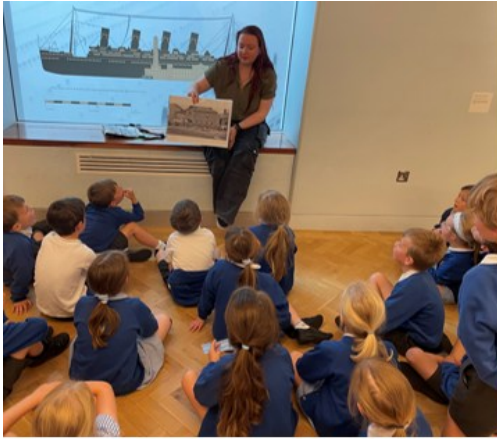
