We think it is crucial that you help us to reduce speeding on Ramsdean Road. They have been noticed more commonly at breakfast and after school club hours. Even though there may not be any people crossing the road, there still should not be any people excessively speeding. We think you should add some flashing speed signs or repeater signs that say 20mph and not over. Thankyou for your time and we look forward to your response.

Year 5's River Study Trip



What a fantastic trip we had to Gilbert White on Wednesday!

Team Swift went to the museum as part of their Geography unit on Rivers. We spent the morning off site down by the river which runs along the Hangers Way and is a tributary for the River Wey. We had to complete three activities – measuring the depth of the river at 20cm intervals in order to record its profile; using plastic ducks to calculate the velocity of the river at various points; and finally, a spot of river fishing where we found a small fish and a leech! After lunch we used natural resources to design our own river, thinking about the journey it takes from the source to the mouth. Our last activity of the day was some orienteering around the grounds and there was absolutely no cheating and no children were kidnapped from other teams to prevent them from winning...!

The children were immaculately behaved, as always, and we are now all river experts!

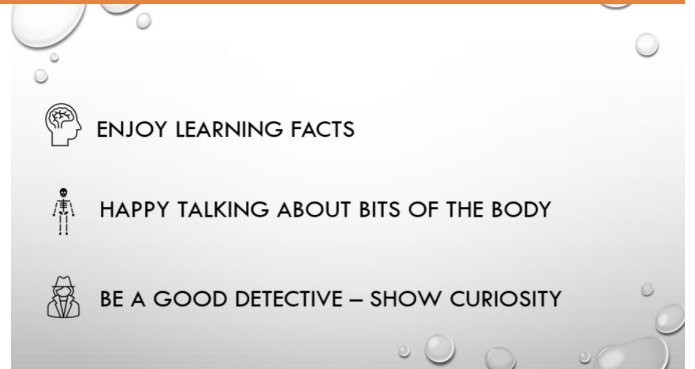
