Be prepared!

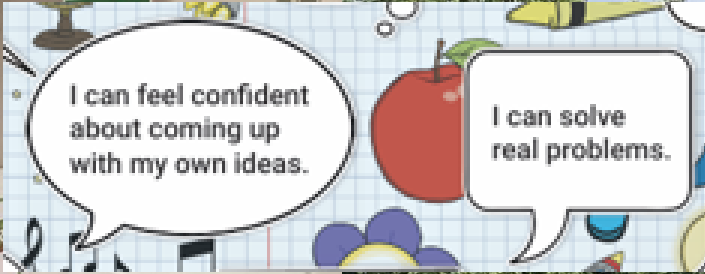
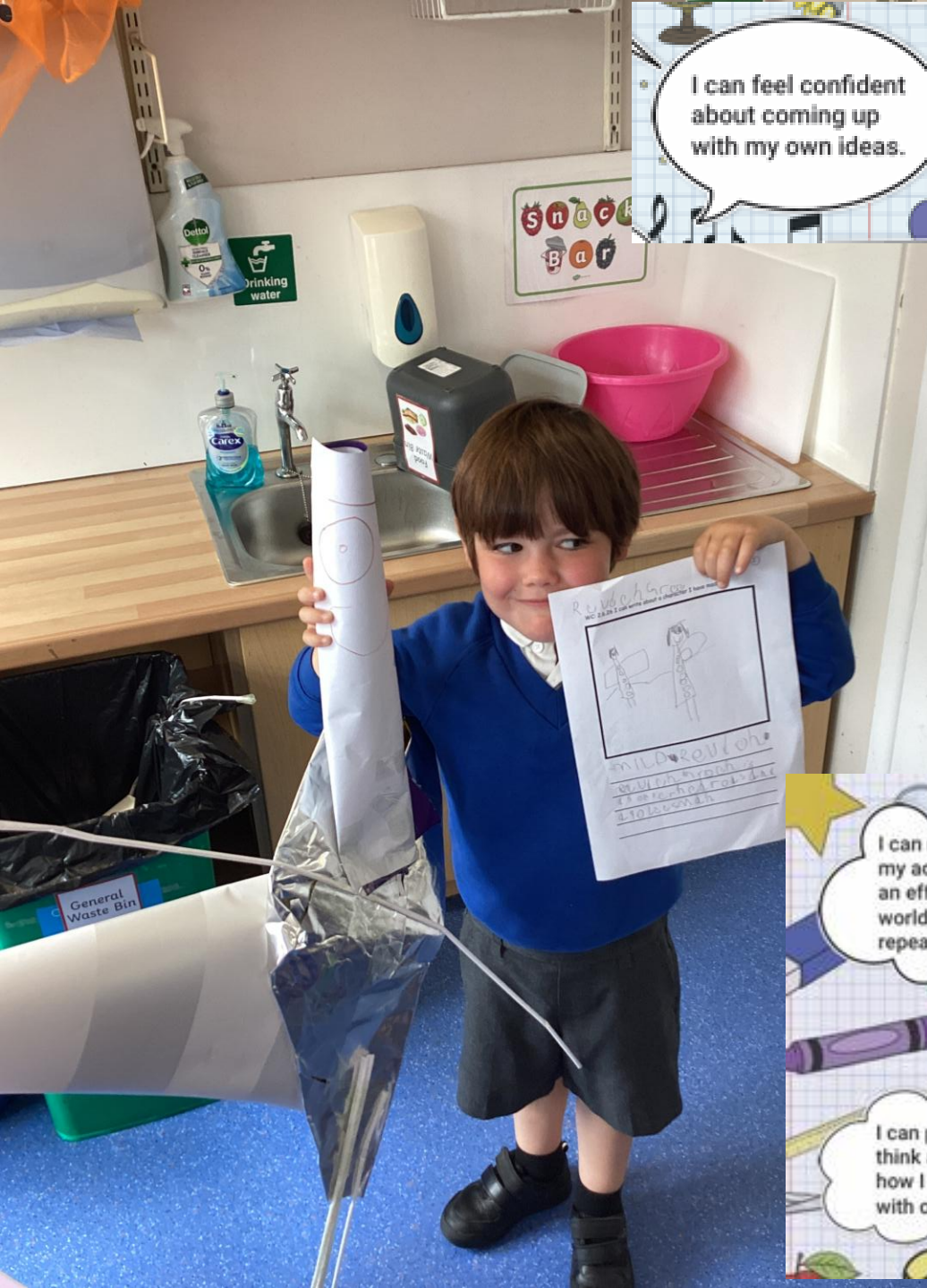
- Children **come to school in their PE kits on the days when they have PE lessons or Forest School** (Thursdays and Fridays).
- On all other days, children should come to school in their school uniform (see virtual office webpage for details).
- **Forest School is on a Friday afternoon** and children must have wellies, raincoats and trousers to allow them to enjoy the session in all weathers and to protect them from any prickly plants in the forest. Wellies can be left in school and forest kits are brought in weekly but please ensure they are clearly named.
- Reading wallets will be provided for every child once they are ready to begin home/school reading routines. These should then be brought into school daily.
- All children should have a **coat and water bottle** (named). A variety of snacks are provided (termly fee of £1, payable via ScoPay – see named letter) and school meals are currently also provided for all infant children.



What does Early Years look like at Langrish?

- At Langrish, we are proud of our outstanding Early Years provision. We ensure all children feel safe, secure and valued. No core learning takes place until children are ready. We promote a more play based approach to learning through trial and error, key texts, experiences and oracy.
- We encourage children to be independent, confident, and high-level learners. We focus heavily on the **Characteristics of Effective Learning (next slide)**.
- Children are challenged through questioning and well thought out resources.
- Solid routine, good, open parent partnership.



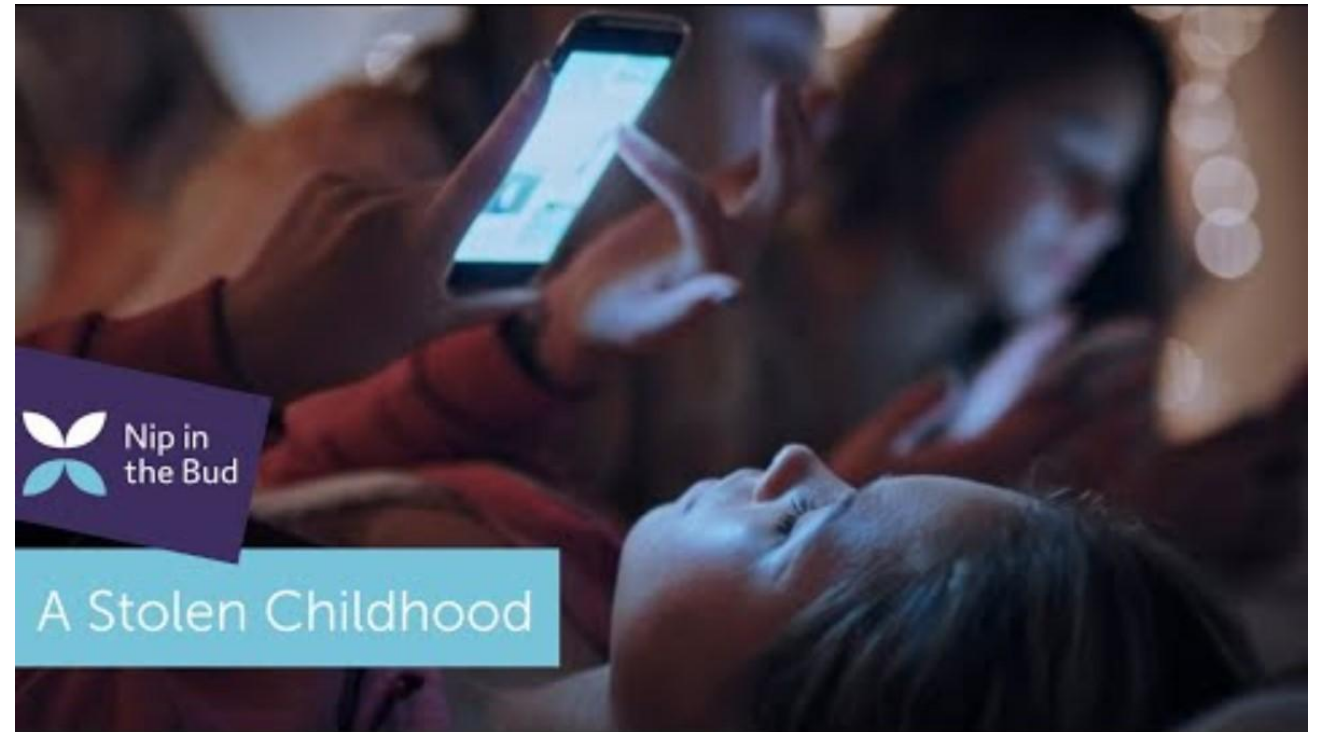


Characteristics of effective learning

- Playing and exploring – children investigate and experience things and ‘have a go’
- Active learning – children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties and enjoy achievements.
- Creating and thinking critically – children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas and develop strategies for doing things.

Smartphone Free Childhood

- Langrish Primary School is a Smartphone Free School; we are part of the Petersfield Area Schools cluster who have committed to the Smartphone Free movement with our local secondary school now banning smartphones for pupils in Year 7-8 altogether.
- As part of this commitment, we have looked at how we are using technology across the school and have worked hard to reduce screen time replacing this with songs, circle times, games, brain breaks and stories to enhance oracy.
