Fabulous Fundraising

A huge thank you to everyone involved in this year's fundraising. Our FoLS committee have worked tirelessly to put on an exciting range of activities for the children beyond the school day and your support, whether as a volunteer at one of their events or simply by signing your child up to take part, has made it all possible. The Colour Run and Summer Festivals were new events to add to the calendar this year and both proved popular, bringing plenty of smiles. Through their efforts and additional donations, this year **you have raised an amazing £15,833.45!**

This has provided funding for transport on trips, reducing the cost to families throughout the year, brought the pantomime to us on the last day of Autumn Term and made it possible for us to go ahead with a landscaping project for the Year R area. At the end of the summer holidays our current canopy, pirate ship and other hardstanding pieces of equipment will be removed in readiness for a new, much larger canopy, which will be fitted during October half term, along with new surfacing to the area. This project is designed to make the Year R space usable year-round, providing shelter from the rain in winter and sun in the summer months.

In order to continue pushing forward with such improvements in the years ahead, we will no longer be using funds raised through FoLS to pay for the transport on trips. Instead, this will be passed back to you, increasing costs by approximately £15 per pupil, per trip. We remain mindful of the pressures this puts on families and are therefore publishing our planned trips now so you can see what is coming up. With the exception of Years 4 and 6, each class has only one paid trip during the academic year. These are chosen with great care to ensure maximum value for money against the children's learning, prioritising experiences that cannot be easily emulated in school. If you are concerned about this change and would like to discuss assistance with funding for your child/family, please do make an appointment in confidence to discuss this with Miss Jones. In the meantime, take a look at the planned visits for the coming year!
