



Langrish School E-Safety Agreement



At Langrish, we are committed to the use of computer technologies and recognise the Internet as a valuable tool for learners of all ages. However, we also acknowledge that computers, tablets and other Internet-enabled devices do have the potential for inappropriate use and access to undesirable material from which we have a duty of care to protect our pupils.

In order to fulfil that duty of care, Langrish School will:

- Use a filtered Internet service to prevent access to sites containing inappropriate material.
- Ensure that all Internet access within the school is supervised by an adult.
- Continue to maintain a high standard of safeguarding training for our staff, including e-safety.
- Use age-appropriate lessons, assemblies and resources to educate our pupils about the responsible use of technology, enabling them to make the most of the Internet by equipping them with strategies for dealing with some of the threats, dangers and challenges they may face in the online world.

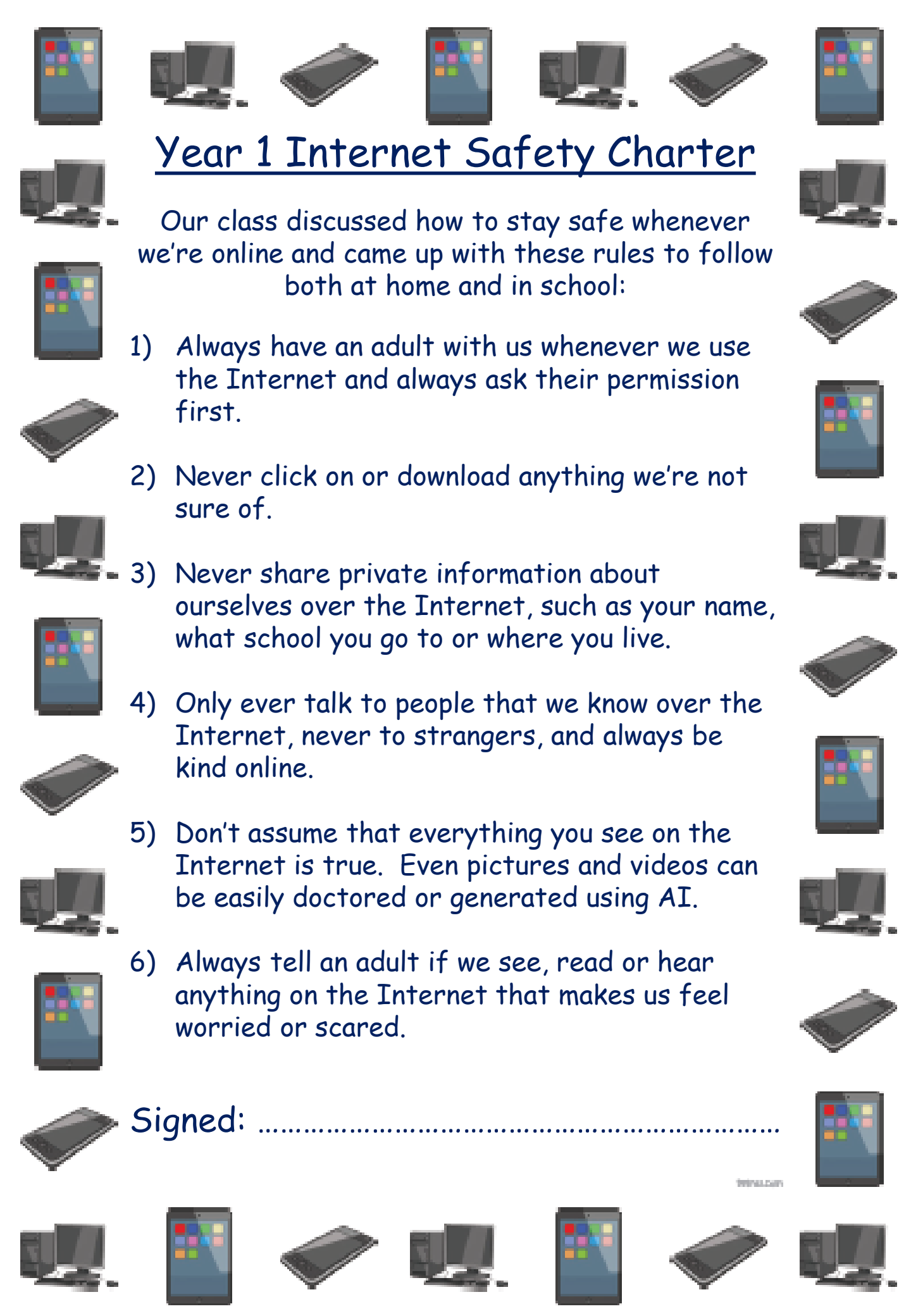

Year 1 Internet Safety Charter

Our class discussed how to stay safe whenever we're online and came up with these rules to follow both at home and in school:

- 1) Always have an adult with us whenever we use the Internet and always ask their permission first.
- 2) Never click on or download anything we're not sure of.
- 3) Never share private information about ourselves over the Internet, such as your name, what school you go to or where you live.
- 4) Only ever talk to people that we know over the Internet, never to strangers, and always be kind online.
- 5) Don't assume that everything you see on the Internet is true. Even pictures and videos can be easily doctored or generated using AI.
- 6) Always tell an adult if we see, read or hear anything on the Internet that makes us feel worried or scared.
